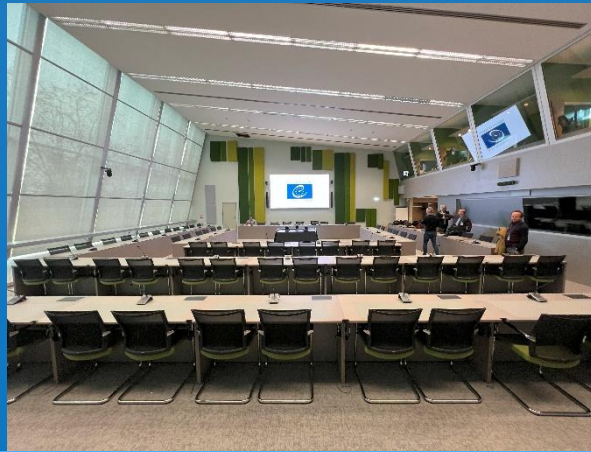

# Session principles <sup>[1/2]</sup>

---

- focus on the emerging issues on the European agenda
- avoid duplication or “just more of the same”  
(Check the wiki archive for previous years!)
- avoid seminar style (not a series of presentations)
- time distribution: 50/50 – speakers / audience
- each speaker - 3 min “punchy” statements (timer)

# Session principles [2/2]

---

- not more than 4 speaker in Workshops

### Session teaser [edit]

The impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI) on digital human rights, particularly regarding its potential and the risks it may pose to fundamental rights such as equality and non-discrimination, is a critical concern of our times. In Europe, existing regulations – such as the Council of Europe (CoE) Framework Convention and the EU AI Act – provide a framework for procedural rights, safeguards, and remedies. However, more efforts are needed to ensure that AI systems contribute to the promotion of equality and offer robust protection to vulnerable groups from potential bias and side effects.

This session will explore practical measures to establish effective safeguards and remedies against discrimination in AI systems, particularly in online environments. It will look on how to better engage with the groups most at risk, and how to empower human rights supervisory bodies to strengthen oversight and accountability.
